CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS MEETING AGENDA MINUTES December 12, 2024 at 6:30 p.m.

- 1. Call to order and quorum call. Mayor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. In attendance were Alderwoman Alvarado, Alderwoman Madero, Alderman Tremblay, Alderman Repino, Alderman Fillinger, City Attorney and City Secretary, we have a quorum.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance. Led by Mayor Martinez
- 3. Citizens to be heard. Persons wishing to speak may sign up with the City Secretary in the time and manner as indicated above. Mayor announced Mr. Chavez has the floor. It is now 6:32 p.m. Mr. Chavey stated he has resided on 23135 Dragon Rock for over 23 years. One of his concerns, after the gas line leak back in May, is why did the gas company shut his gas account. He also wanted to express his frustration regarding City Hall. Mr. Chavez mentioned he suffers from various illnesses, and he makes an effort to come out to city hall to get assistance with his gas account and to voice other concerns and no one is here at city hall. The Mayor mentioned to Mr. Chavez that he was out of time, and that his concerns are noted and asked Mr. Chavez to grab some cards and he would get with him after the meeting. Next to speak is Mr. Jones. Mr. Jones stated that he had a couple of things. One is the entrance to Interstate I-37, there needs to be stop signs or yield signs on either side of the road, maybe some solar powered one, they don't cost much maybe \$800 to \$1500 each. Also, he wanted to mention that Spectrum pulled their truck and trailer all the way to the middle of his yard. He stated that if Spectrum is going to do work out in this area, they should have a least one person that speaks English. Mayor thanked Mr. Jones for coming to the council meeting and letting us know what Spectrum was doing.
- 4. Mayor & Administrator Announcements/Updates. Mayor would like to thank Alderman Coffindaffer who is no longer on Council and welcome our newest Alderwoman Monica Madero. Welcome to the team. Next is the Angel Tree, if citizens have not signed up already, please contact the Community Center and pick a child to support. It is certainly appreciated by not only the kids, but also the parents and those that are less fortunate. By your assistance, you can make them have a magical Christmas, and lastly, Happy Holidays and Happy New Year. Thank you to everybody that comes out, thank you to the employees and staff that really helped to make the city what it is and thank you to the citizens that are the backbone of this community to help us. 6. Financial Report

a. The income and expenses for November 2024 will be reported by City Secretary Delma Doyal with possible discussion and/or action. City Secretary reported the General Fund balance on November 30, 2024 ended with a balance of \$302,011.57, the ARPA Fund balance at \$103,631.08, and the TDA Grant Fund balance at \$15,544.20. A question by Alderman Madero brought up a charge of \$900.00 as a bank charge, which Mayor stated we are looking into this fee, which we think is the fee for six Panini auto check deposit machines which we did not order and another bank charge of \$74.25.

Motion - Repino & Madero - to accept the financial report as presented minus the \$74.25 and the \$900 bank fee charge - Passed Unanimously.

7. Public Works

a. Updates and Announcements from Public Works Director Priscilla Schmitt with possible discussion and/or action. Public Works Director stated that the community can see that we Public Works did put up a digital sign indicating the city is going to have some stop signs coming soon. The signs and the materials have been ordered. They have contacted 811, and they came out and located the places and now we are just waiting for the stop signs. We will start installing them on December 17, and the community can be prepared for a safer New Mathis Road.

8. Animal Control

- a. Updates and Announcements from ACO Cunningham with possible discussion and/or action. ACO, Ashley Cunningham and her Assistant drove to Austin Pets Alive in Austin to deliver a puppy with parvo. Austin Pets Alive was the only vet facility that would take the puppy with parvo, that way the city would not have euthanize it. With that said, Austin Pets Alive stated they would like to partner with us to assist with any of the dogs that come in. RAD is also still working with us, as well. Then we have our private volunteers that help us save the dogs and get them adopted. So, November was a very busy month.
- b. Presentation of monthly report by ACO Cunningham with possible discussion and/or action. ACO presented the report.
- c. Discuss and/or possible action on quote for electricity to be run to Animal Control Metal Building. I spoke with the veterinarian about the plugs and the electricity that is needed in the barn. He stated that he needed anti-shadow lights, but said that the lights that were there would suffice, but would need a surge protector for the freezer and a plug for his shaver. He also recommended to get a small freezer for vaccines. Austin Pets Alive, did say they would be able to potentially get us vaccines so that ACO can vaccinate on intake. The council stated that as long as the electrician is licensed, bonded and has insurance that they would accept whoever gave the best quote.

Motion – Madero & Tremblay – to allow Alderman Tremblay, Public Works Director and the Vet to get together and solicit some quotes for this electrical work based on the requirements provided by the veterinarian – Passed Unanimously.

a. Update and Announcements from Park Advisory Committee Chair Alderman Repino with possible discussion and/or action. The meeting was held on Tuesday, November 10, it was kind of lively as citizens were giving donations and picking angels from the tree. The ladies were wrapping presents. They were excited about the septic tank being pumped out. Happy about the picnic table. They were hopeful more donations would be dropped off. They were generally in a good mood. They did talk about some things they may want to do later on the month or even next year. The next meeting will be on January 7, 2025 at 5:30 p.m.

11. Administration - Old Business

- b. Discuss and/or possible action on an ordinance regulating fences. Mayor announced this is the Second reading of the Ordinance. Alderwoman Madero announced point of order, stated according to City Ordinance 2019-149 after the first meeting the reading on a proposed ordinance. It is supposed to be posted on the City's website, the first business day after the meeting and remain visible for the citizens to review for 14 days or until the next meeting. I do not believe this one was posted for the citizens to review after it was first presented. Don't you think we need to wait for the second reading or until after the citizens have an opportunity to review and provide feedback either directly to the council members or via City Secretary.

 - Motion Madero & Repino to amend the motion to try and get a minimum of one council member, but try and have two council members Passed Unanimously.
- 1. Discuss and/or possible action on approving Cyber Liability and Data Breach Response Coverage and authorizing the mayor or designee to negotiate, approve and execute a Cyber Liability and Data Breach Response Interlocal Agreement with the Texas Municipal League Intergovernmental Risk Pool. In previous years TML provided free cyber security coverage for all TML cities. This year TML mailed all the cities an Interlocal Agreement offering the cities coverage with a fee of \$1000 a year. Council authorized the mayor to negotiate the agreement, with the city attorney's review and return the agreement but not to exceed \$1850. Motion Madero & Repino to have the mayor negotiate and sign the Agreement, with a not to exceed, \$1850.00 and to sign the Interlocal Agreement with the attorney's approval Passed Unanimously.
