RESOLUTION NO. 2026-247

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTY AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE THE SALE OR DISPOSAL OF SAID PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City of Sandy Oaks, Texas ("City") is the owner of certain items of personal property described as described as a 2014 brown Chevrolet Tahoe, used primarily by the Police Department and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the aforesaid personal property is not needed or required for the City's foreseeable needs but still has some usefulness for the purpose they were originally intended and may or may not have value and therefore determined as surplus property; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to dispose of the surplus property identified herein and authorize the City Administrator to sell or dispose of said property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS. The City Council finds the statements made in the preamble above are true and correct.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY. The City Council hereby declares the personal property described as a 2014 brown Chevrolet Tahoe, used primarily by the Police Department, is not needed or required for the City's foreseeable needs, but finds the personal property described herein still has some usefulness for the purposes they were originally intended for, and may or may not have value, and therefore declares such personal property as surplus property of the City.


SECTION 3. AUTHORIZATION OF SALE OR DISPOSAL. The City Administrator is hereby authorized to sell or dispose of said personal property in any manner in compliance with State law, including the advertisement and acceptance of bids for said property.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Resolution, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid or unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution, and the City Council hereby declares that it would have passed such portions remaining despite invalidity or unconstitutionality.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.


